Dear Parent and Carers

Welcome to the New Year newsletter from Mill Water School. Time has moved on quickly since we wrote to you in the last newsletter before Christmas and we have much to update you with. First of all, I would like to say that it was so good to meet many of you at the events before Christmas. Amongst many end of term activities, we held a very successful Christmas Fayre – a huge thank you to all in the PTFA who organised this event. Well done to everyone in class 1, 2 and lower school - your nativities really set the standard this year. Thank you so much to staff across the school who worked so hard to make our Christmas celebrations so special for all of our children. Interim Leadership Arrangements

We have made some changes to our leadership team here at Mill Water School. We need to make sure that the whole leadership team has the capacity and the drive to ensure that we are able to meet the challenges of the future, not least to ensure that the rapid and sustained pace of improvement across the school continues as it has done under the leadership of Sarah Pickering. In order to support the work of the school, and to support Sarah whilst she continues to recover from her serious accident, Governors have asked me to remain as Interim Headteacher until the end of the summer term. I will be supported in this by Sarah Pickering and Sally Cregan as school Deputy Head Teachers with a particular focus on Teaching and Learning and Pastoral Care. They will be very ably supported by Kayleigh Price (Lower School), Roz Harman (Upper School) and Sarah Clarke (Complex Needs) as well as the wider team of excellent staff across the school. I am sure you will join me in wishing Sarah Pickering a full and speedy recovery.

Homework Consultation and Parents / Carers Survey

Many thanks to all of you who returned the recent homework consultation and parent and carers survey. We will be taking time across this term to speak with everybody in school including staff and pupils to find out how we can do things even better. Feedback from consultations is a key part of this – you will already know that we always ask for comments on how we can improve after every whole school event and we are always ready to learn.
