



### Headteacher's Newsletter - June 2017

#### Dear Parent and Carers

Welcome to the June newsletter. It was good to meet and speak to those parents and carers who were able to come to the cream tea before we broke up for half term. We have a very busy term ahead, not least with the Freshwater residential currently underway, but with development planning across the school following our Ofsted visit; we will of course keep you posted with plans as they are developed.

#### **School Bat Week**

We have been working with the Devon Greater Horseshoe Bat Project (DGHBP) to raise awareness of the importance of Devon to the international population of Greater Horseshoe Bats. The DGHBP are doing some amazing work with schools and have been very supportive at Mill Water. During the week of the 8th May the whole school got involved in making bat boxes, learning about these amazing creatures through sensory stories, creative projects and online games, activities and footage.

We are using a 'Anabat' bat detector, courtesy of the DGHBP, to find out exactly what species of bat we have at Mill Water and encouraging them through appropriate planting and orchard management. During the week of 15th of May, the whole school visited Beer Quarry Caves to see where these animals spend their winters and experience the cave environment. The children learnt not only about bats but about conserving the wildlife around us, that endangered animals are worth saving and why and that lesser known species in Britain can be under just as much pressure and as important as the rhinos and tigers we hear so much about.

The event gave our children the opportunity to engage in curriculum enriching activities that relate directly to our local environment.

# Safeguarding news - Sarah Pickering - Designated Senior Leader

I am sure you will all be aware of the bleak news about the bombing in Manchester after the Ariane Grande concert and the following attack on London this weekend. Many of the victims are children.

The initial findings from Manchester are that it was a lone suicide bomber from a family who fled Libya many years ago. He had been born and schooled in the UK and his family had been in Manchester for at least ten years.

Behaviour tracking and monitoring online use will be key in plotting the lead up to the bombing. Something we do so well here at Mill Water. The "it could happen here" mentality remains central to our preventative measures as school staff.

We feel very safe in our Devon haven but must remain vigilant as anyone can be affected. One of our colleagues has been; their close family members were injured in the bombing so our thoughts go out to them.

Prevent is part of safeguarding so we must remain professionally curious and report any concerns to the DSLs or straight to the police.

I attended a Prevent Partnership meeting with representatives from the police, counter terrorist units and the prison service. The case of Damon Smith was discussed in great detail as this was a young man from a special school in Devon who went on to plant a bomb on a London tube. From the age of 10 he had been fascinated with knives, bombs and extreme violence. The question to the group was "could we have done more to prevent this incident".

- A high number of acts of lone terrorism/extremist acts are conducted by those with ASC.
- 80% are male.
- The primary factor in people being radicalised is through the internet.
- 27% of extremist acts are from right wing groups which is on the rise.

As a school we will always continue to be vigilant in our monitoring of internet use and pupils' behaviour and ideologies.
