New Mill Water Library Appeal

The impact of Covid has seen greater reliance on electronics, so it is more important than ever to progress with our exciting plans to renovate Mill Water's library. This will ensure there is a safe and accessible space for small groups of children to engage in both their love of reading and their love of stories and text.



We are currently shortlisting contractors who have submitted innovative designs for the room adjacent to the canteen area. We are also launching a fundraising campaign for the renovations and new books. The new library will open out onto our courtyard space, which is also earmarked for improvements.

Stories are key to providing relevant and meaningful vocabulary to pupils and to support their communication skills. We have recently appointed literacy tutor Vicky Woolsey to oversee the library and phonics intervention.

One of the pupils from class 12 has asked several staff and pupils (in doorways whilst keeping a safe distance) which library design they prefer for the new library renovations. She created a tally chart to see which option was the most popular and option 2 came out as the winning design. She is very keen on running a library lunchtime club with Vicky which is fantastic. More news to follow as the renovations get underway!

Vicky has also got underway with her Literacy interventions in her newly revamped room. This week pupils have enjoyed using the rainbow letters around the room, practising their handwriting and working on their phonics knowledge and reading skills. Vicky is also busy preparing for World Read Aloud Day next week: Wednesday January 4th 2021.
