The memorial plaques from the previous school have been transferred to the new school and have been remounted by the children. A commemorative bench has also been placed in the garden. We had meaningful discussions with the children about remembering people and pets that have passed away.

The children have worked hard on the many small tasks required to keep the space safe, productive and beautiful.

Tasks have included digging vegetable beds, mowing lawns and paths, weeding borders, clearing apples, planting bulbs and creating winter habitats for insects, reptiles and mammals. The children learn valuable skills and enjoy the work, even in the wet when adults are less keen!
