Class 12 are working on a programme of travel training which teaches pupils personal safety, decision making, problem solving, money matters, route planning and in this current climate how to keep Covid safe. David has been proud of his class as they have worked together, dealing with all the changes in social expectations that are currently in place. Class 12 have also shown the weather what we think of it and have continued to enjoy forest school activities.

At the other end of the school we have 8 new EYFS starters who have all enjoyed investigating their new school environment.

Class 7 have been nonstop this week and I had a hard time picking the best photos. In science they have been making predictions and testing them out, subtracting to 30 using as range of strategies and using natural resources for art during outdoor learning.

You will notice that most of our cooking sessions will involve apples as our orchard has provided an abundance as usual. There has been juice, crumble, cakes, muffins and pies all made over the last few weeks with our own delicious apples giving the Great British Bake Off a run for its money. I hope you enjoy tasting them as much as I have.

Class 9 had a visit to Greendale Farm Shop to buy cooking ingredients and the have a tour of the animals (donkeys, ponies, chickens, goats, highland cows, deer and geese) where the pupils fed them with carrots and chicken food.





We continue to have very low numbers of Covid 19 cases in East Devon which is of course really positive news. We have been committed to reducing the risk of infection and have fallen into excellent routines at school including hand washing, giving space where possible and keeping all our resources with us.
