New Sensory Rooms and Intervenor Training



Pupils have been loving our new sensory integration and soft play rooms, which were installed during the Easter break and kindly funded by the Clare Milne Trust <u>www.claremilnetrust.com</u>

The rooms will support their physical development and spatial awareness, as well as provide a calming and safe space for pupils to engage in activities, release energy and play.



We have also had 12 staff attend a highly beneficial 5-day Intervenor course to help support our pupils with multi-sensory needs and visual and hearing impairments. Attending staff are now certified as Trained Intervenors and are eligible to join the National Organisation of Intervenors. Their training will complement our work with pupils in the newly refurbished rooms.

The staff all agreed it was some of the best training they had attended and have already made changes in their own practice.



Staff said:

"It was incredible to experience the world through the eyes & ears of a deaf/blind child and really made me realise what they have to manage"

"It is useful for all pupils with sensory issues, impairments and barriers, not just deaf/blind students"

"It has changed how I support a change in staff and introduce myself to the child each time"

"I couldn't wait to get into the class after the training and put it to use" "During the training I kept thinking of pupils it would be great for back in class"

"I really like the idea of quiet pods for the children as their own space"
