Giant Colourscape event comes to Mill Water

The smiles said it all as pupils enjoyed a multi-sensory explosion of colour and light when the amazing Colourscape experience came to Mill Water last week. They bounced, raced and giggled their way around the interconnecting chambers in their individual classes, while immersed in translucent red, blue, green, yellow and opaque grey.




Class 6 teacher and sensory integration lead Andrew Maker said: "All the pupils had a great time. The layout allowed for freedom of movement and the mixtures of colours was very appealing and soothing. Any anxieties or stresses pupils may have had were left behind the moment they entered the dome. A real treat for all."

Class 12 pupils' responses included: "It was very, very, very good because it had some amazing colours in it." (Harry P). "The dome was really good and fun, it made me feel relaxed." (Charlie). "The dome was weird but made me feel really relaxed and calm." (Libby).

TA Vicky Woolsey said: "Seeing Pearce having so much fun made my day. He was smiling and laughing the whole session and for him to be able to roam freely in the dome was amazing. I would say the older pupils had just as much fun as the younger ones. What a magical experience for them all."

Some reactions from Class 7 included: "It was really great, it was really fun." "I liked everything there, I wish I could go back there again." "Fun!" "I liked running in it." "It was colourful and bright." "It felt like going through the colours." "When we were playing hide and seek, it was good fun together." "It was so amazing; it was the best thing that has ever happened to me." "I wish the class was the colour dome and I wish the colour dome was at my birthday."



The experience was the result of multiple partnerships between Mill Water and Budleigh Music Festival (who facilitated the project and also hosted the event on Budleigh Green last week), Bicton College (who allowed us to set up on their rugby pitch) and Colourscape. It was largely funded through the Arts Council, with additional support from the Budleigh-based Sampimon Trust and Devon Music Education Hub.



Nature art workshop



Pupils combined their connection with natural textures and art to produce these beautiful prints. Visiting artist Simon Ripley from Exeter's Double Elephant Print Workshop helped Class 3 and 4 pupils 'explore their emotional links with the landscape' while using traditional print techniques. This opportunity was created through funding from the Norman Family Charitable Trust and Arts Council England. Simon will return to work with further classes in the Autumn term.
