Fundraising

We have been working hard to continue to raise the profile of Mill Water in the local community, to find new opportunities for our pupils and to raise valuable funds for the school. If you know any organisations or businesses who might be able to offer work placements for our pupils please do let us know so that we can continue to extend the opportunities that are available.

We recently benefitted from Exeter's Big Noise Choir, whose concert on 11th March raised at least £1450 for the school – a huge success, in no small part due to the hard work of The Friends of Mill Water School who helped plan the event and provided fantastic refreshments on the night, and the Sassy Choir and Mill Water Staff Choir who performed together brilliantly.





We have recently also benefitted from fundraising we didn't even know was happening! The Budleigh Male Voice Choir have kindly donated £300, raised at a recent concert – many thanks to them for their generosity. Budleigh Lions also continue to support the school by putting us in touch with local charities and organisations, and we are very grateful for their ongoing support.

The Friends of Mill Water are also continuing their support for the Sensory Orchard Project, which is developing brilliantly under the leadership and supervision of TA Tom Neusinger. We were delighted to receive an award of £10,000 to continue to develop the orchard, thanks to *Awards for All* and the hard work of our Business Manager, Gail Evans.

The orchard was a fantastic space for us to use during the RSPB's *Big Bird Watch*, for which pupils set up a hide and created and maintained a bird feeding area. The children learned about species

diversity, the importance of knowing numbers and the type of birds locally compared to the national picture, and about caring for the creatures in the environment. We have recently been awarded the RSPB's Bronze Wildlife Action Award for improving the environment for birds, wildlife and people, and we hope to go on to achieve the Silver and Gold awards in due course.







Having spent a full year here on our Bicton site, and watching the changing of the seasons, we are really beginning to fully appreciate the green spaces around us. Let's hope it's a good summer so we can make the most of our lovely location!

The new site has been designed to be much more interactive to help improve our communication with parents and carers. Admin staff are currently being trained on how to use the new system, and we'll be in touch again when the site is ready to go live.

Thank you to those parents and carers who responded to the School Development Plan consultation. Your views are crucial to the future development of the school, and I plan to continue to gather your thoughts and ideas as the school moves forward.

National Picture

You may have seen or read in the news that the government has announced that all schools are to become academies by 2020. Governors have already discussed this, and have appointed Martin Callaghan to act as strategic lead on this issue. Please be assured that governors will always prioritise acting in the best interests of the school and our pupils, and will take as much time as necessary to gather information and research the available options. We feel hopeful about the process as several institutions have already approached the school with an interest in sharing our SEN expertise and the good practice that they see at Mill Water.

I feel it is also important for parent and carers to be kept informed about current developments and discussions that are taking place between the Department for Education, Devon County Council and special schools. The Department for Education is questioning why special schools are providing full-time sixth-form places when mainstream schools are only able to provide three days per week for students. We are working very closely with Devon County Council to discuss what this might mean for Mill Water's sixth-form, and our priority throughout will be making sure our pupils are able to access appropriate and well thought-out provision. I will contact you again as soon as I have further information about this.

Governing Body

Governors are continuing to monitor the school as it continues on its journey towards an Ofsted judgement of 'Good'. We have been working closely with leaders of education from across the country, including Darryl Morgan, Sean Kretz, Paul Scott and Sue Smith. Their most recent visits have highlighted some of the progress the school has already made:

'What was apparent was the huge amount of thought and planning that has gone into redesigning the manner in which teaching and learning is led and directed. The underlying emphasis was on personalised approaches to challenging learning for each child. Staff were enthusiastic and clearly motivated to ensure that new strategies are both implemented and working for the children.' (National Leader of Education, September 2015)

'The headteacher has moved the school forward and developed a team that is performing well and has the potential to be amongst the best.' (E-Visit Report, October 2015)

'Students work very well in lessons that are well planned to meet the needs of individuals and their next step in their education journey and head towards external accreditation for their work.' (E-Visit Report, October 2015)
