Dear Parents / Carers

If last week's theme was the raft of changes that we receive from the DfE, I have to report that the theme has continued this week. We have now been informed that the lateral flow testing regime for staff that we have implemented over the last couple of weeks can no longer include daily testing for close contacts. This has meant having to send home staff who had opted to be tested daily following our positive case last week. From next week we are also advised to test staff twice weekly, which will obviously double the time required. We are doing our utmost to comply with all the guidance we get, but you will appreciate that this is not always easy.

Despite the changes to the testing regime and fewer staff being available, we have continued to offer placements, walks out and remote learning to all families, as you require them. Please let us know if you need a change to your offer.

We have also noticed how different this lockdown is compared to the first, in terms of the weather. Some walks out have had to be cancelled because of the heavy rain & cold and for that I apologise but staff can't stay wet and cold all day. Saying that, most have gone ahead regardless and our pupils have enjoyed the puddles and the wet (probably more than the staff!).

I have shared photos of our pupils working really hard with their home learning and many of you have been pleasantly surprised by the effort they've been putting in. I get shown a lot of work in school and I can assure you everything gets seen and discussed. I have sent home quite a few certificates over the last 3 weeks so keep it coming. Don't forget that home learning can be cycling, making a bed, feeding the birds, taking turns completing a puzzle etc. No accomplishment is too small.

Exciting building update-we have finalised the plans for our new sensory integration and physio rooms and with a bit of luck the first instalments will begin during February half term. This has been made a reality by the fundraising efforts of Georgia who got a grant of £19000 for these spaces.

Fundraising was already in a very strong position thanks to the fantastic efforts of our outgoing PTFA committee. We have some new starters-see below.
