Lego designs










Class 12



Please let the school know via the email address covid19@millwater.devon.sch.uk if your child develops symptoms or tests positive for Covid-19 (via PCR or LFD test) within 2 days of them being at school. We will then identify close contacts and advise them to self-isolate.
