Safeguarding our children throughout the school holidays

The staff team will not be making telephone calls or welfare checks throughout the summer break, as it is vitally important they have the opportunity to relax and recharge. We would politely request that you do not email staff, nor expect replies to any emails, during the summer break.

Safeguarding our children is everyone's responsibility and during this coronavirus pandemic we know that some families will be facing new or increasing pressures and challenges. Devon County Council's Early Help System is there for you. Their message to families is simple: in Devon there is no wrong door. If you need some help, or if you are concerned for the wellbeing of a child or young person, talk to a professional about it.

Whilst the school is closed, you can get help in a number of ways:

- Talk to someone you are already in contact with, for example, a health visitor or your GP.
- Search on Pinpoint Devon. It has details of thousands of community services and groups available in Devon.
- Call DCC Customer Service Centre on 0345 1551071. They are open Monday to Friday 8am– 8pm and Saturdays 9am–1pm
