Have you seen the teaching kitchen recently? We have taken delivery of some very smart new equipment. It has been purchased by the PTFA using money donated from the spring concert of the Big Noise Chorus in Exeter. For this first delivery we took advice from Marion, a TA in Class 7, who has many years' experience leading cooking classes in the school.

In the parcel we received Kenwood hand mixers, Lakeland muffin tins and multi-purpose oven trays, three heavy duty anodised 3.5 litre saucepans, a Sage kinetic twist blender and a Sage Pro scraper mixer. The Sage range of products have professional strength motors but are designed for use in a domestic kitchen. The Sage range has been endorsed by Heston Blumenthal. We will be putting them to the test - let's see if they are as good as he claims.

The Big Noise Chorus gave us a lovely plaque, which is now on the wall in the kitchen, re-naming the room the Big Noisy Kitchen. Given the hustle and bustle of use that it gets every day, this seems a very appropriate name for the room.
