Online Safety at home

We are aware that some of our pupils are playing games or using apps which contain disturbing content or which could leave them vulnerable to grooming. This whole area is a minefield for parents/carers and it is impossible to keep up to date with the latest sites. If you would value the opportunity to meet with other parents to discuss

Bringing own devices to school

Many of our children are bringing iPads or other devices into school to use as part of their communication programme or to distract/entertain them on the journey to and from school. Where the iPad is being used for communication, the devices are generally not used by other members of the child's family. Sometimes, however, the device is used by other adults or children in the home. Where this is the case, please ensure that your child is unable to access any inappropriate material. We have put some helpful advice on setting up Apple devices safely on the school website. Please refer to this if you are unsure about Content and Privacy Restriction.

Play Event @ Playdome in Honiton

A parent of one of our pupils Jitka Jakubcova has been in contact with her daughter's former preschool teacher Danni Stapley. Danni has been in contact with Playdome in Honiton regarding an opening of which is solely for those with autism/additional needs. They were very helpful and have agreed to open 1 hour earlier this **Saturday 16th February 9 - 10 am**. For those who can't make this Saturday the next session will be on **Saturday 2nd March 9 - 10am**.

There is a maximum height limit at Playdome which is 4 foot 10 / 148cm. This is a chance for the children to play in a safe, secure location which also has a lovely large sensory room and a cafe! It also gives the parents/carers a chance to sit, have

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a coffee and be able to talk and ask questions with each other.

This will be starting off for 4 weeks on a trial basis with the sessions being once a fortnight and then Danni will advertise further dates on Facebook, please see the link on Mill Water School PTFA. Please note children will still need to be supervised during play especially in the sensory room. Any questions you have please feel free to ask Danni via the MWS PTFA page.
