



## Headteacher's Newsletter – July 2017

Dear Parent and Carers,

The end of term seems to be approaching fast and we have lots to update you on in this newsletter, but also lots to look forward to in the next few weeks, not least sports day and 'The Wizard of Oz' production.

You will all by now have received a letter from Maggie Carter our chair of Governors outlining next steps for leadership at Mill Water School. We are now in the process of advertising and interviewing for a second Deputy Head post to support the leadership and ensure that school has capacity to continue its rapid pace of progress in all areas. We will also be contacting parents shortly with information on new class groups and teaching staff so that we can organise a smooth transition into learning for September. At the moment we do not have a confirmed name of the therapist who will be covering this leave. Ashleigh will be back in school from September 2018.
